One inspiring story is that of Ntang Julius Meleng, a 2024 Rotary Peace Fellow at Makerere University in Uganda. Through his Social Change Initiative, Julius has worked to empower young people in Cameroon to take active roles in peacebuilding and leadership.

His project provided training in conflict prevention, civic engagement, and leadership to youths and community officials in areas affected by conflict, equipping people to drive sustainable peace efforts.

Julius harnessed Rotary's global network to overcome obstacles, including limited funding and security risks, and make a meaningful impact.

The Rotary Peace Fellowship gave Julius the tools and support to turn his vision into reality. His work embodies *The Magic of Rotary* — the transformative power of connecting people, sharing resources, and uniting for a common purpose.

As we reflect on the achievements of our peace fellows and celebrate Rotary's enduring commitment to peace, let us also recognize the role that everyone in our network of 1.2 million members plays in creating magic through service.

# "THE AMBIDEXTROUS SPIRIT OF ACTIVE ROTARIANS"



In the heart of Singrauli, Madhya Pradesh, history is being rewritten by an extraordinary institution—Veenavadi School, India's first and only ambidextrous school. An ambidextrous personality is able to use the right and left hands equally well. Founded by former army officer S.P. Sarma, this school has garnered global attention for its unique approach to education. Housing 150 students with exceptional abilities, the school trains its learners to write in six different languages using both hands simultaneously. For instance, a student might write Hindi with one hand and English or Urdu with the other, seamlessly.

This fascinating skill, rooted in ambidexterity, is a result of symmetrical development of the left and right brain hemispheres. It is said studies reveal that ambidextrous individuals often display higher levels of cognitive flexibility and problem-solving skills, with above-average IQ levels. Interestingly, only 1% of India's population is naturally ambidextrous. The school draws inspiration from the first President of

India, Dr. Rajendra Prasad, himself an ambidextrous personality.

As I reflect on this inspiring story, it reminds me of the multitasking spirit of Rotarians. Much like the students of Veenavadi School who harmonize complex skills, Rotarians balance multiple roles with precision and purpose.

In Rotary, whether you are a professional or a businessperson, multitasking becomes second nature. We often find ourselves managing critical work responsibilities while simultaneously attending to Rotary commitments. For instance, imagine being deeply engaged in a business decision when a fellow Rotarian reaches out seeking advice on a point in the Manual of Procedure (MOP) or for clarification on a club initiative. Without hesitation, we pause, prioritize, and address their concerns—sometimes immediately, sometimes promising to return with a solution after wrapping up our primary task.

This dual role is not a burden but a joy. I recall countless interactions with Dr. Thomas Vavani, where we've exchanged calls amidst busy schedules—he attending to a patient, and I in the middle of a meeting. Despite the constraints, we always make time to discuss Rotary matters mainly related to TRF Grants, find solutions, and return to our respective duties with renewed focus.

Much like the ambidextrous students who excel in synchronizing complex tasks, Rotarians thrive in balancing their professional and social responsibilities. It's not just about time management; it's about the deep satisfaction of serving others while growing personally and professionally. Many of my Rotarian friends often share how this multitasking brings them immense joy. It's a reflection of our commitment to the Rotary motto, "Service Above Self."

The story of Veenavadi School and the ambidextrous students is a testament to human potential and resilience. It also mirrors the ethos of Rotary, a belief in breaking barriers, pushing limits, and creating meaningful impact. Both remind us that when dedication meets purpose, history is not just written; it is rewritten.



### FROM LOCAL CLUB TO GLOBAL CITIZEN: THE ROTARY JOURNEY OF FRIENDSHIP



My Rotary journey began in 1986 with the Rotary Club of Changanacherry. Like many, I dreamed of making a global impact through service projects, particularly global grants. Our club, considered rural at the time, had limited access to Rotary leadership, making it challenging to navigate the complexities of international partnerships. Undeterred, I became my own Rotary teacher, independently learning the ropes.

A turning point came with an advertisement in the Rotary International bulletin for the Donation in Kind Network. In the pre-internet era, communication relied on letters and faxes. I discovered a UK Rotarian offering assistance with free limb camps and immediately faxed him. This led to a seven-page application for a matching grant, a daunting document I struggled to understand. Turning to Past District Governor (PDG) Dough Bishop, I confessed my confusion. His guidance proved invaluable, teaching me the entire grant process.

We secured the matching grant, providing 1,000 limbs – a first for our district. This project extended the Rotary Jaipur Limb UK's reach to South India, and I now serve as their Lead Ambassador for India. I've also had the privilege of nominating two of our leaders, DGE Dr. Tina Antony and DGN Krishnan Nair, as Ambassadors of Rotary Jaipur Limb UK.

In 1991, a trip to London coincided with a chance to meet PDG Bishop in person. The 26-year-old Scaria arrived at London Airport and was greeted by a tall, elderly man in a Rotary wheel T-shirt. Bishop and his friend, John Wilton, the primary contact for the limb project, had expected someone much older. This humorous encounter marked the beginning of lasting friendships and impactful collaborations.

Since then, I've been involved in projects across India and numerous countries, including Nepal, Russia, France, Canada, Tonga, Ghana, Sri Lanka, Pakistan, the UK, and Bangladesh. I've worked with over six Rotary districts in India, most Districts in UK, 5 Districts in USA and been associated with over 172 Rotary clubs worldwide. My travels now include welcoming Rotarian families in various countries. As Lead Ambassador for Rotary Jaipur Limb, I help districts in India organize camps, managing multiple global grant projects annually. I also advise several international charities and assist non-Rotary organizations during natural disasters.

My success stems from self-education and a focus on building genuine friendships. The Rotary website and social media offer vast resources for connecting with international partners. However, true connection comes from caring for others and acting with integrity.

John Wilton, my initial contact for the limb camp, remains a close friend. His satisfaction with our project led him to recommend us to others, opening doors to further collaborations. Similarly, friendships with PDG Luz Maria, Rtn George Lewis, PDG Raju V Paul, and Tina Fitch have blossomed into significant partnerships.

Many clubs focus on the mechanics of global grants, neglecting the crucial aspect of relationship building. They submit reports and close grants without nurturing the friendships with international partners. I prioritize consistent communication, sharing project updates, photos, and stories.

Recognizing the contributions of international clubs and their members is essential. Simple gestures like featuring their names on banners and sharing photos that highlight the impact of the project can make a huge difference.

Building strong relationships with primary contacts and their club members is the key to securing future support. I ensure they receive recognition, sometimes even Paul Harris Fellowships. Inviting them to visit can further solidify these bonds. The Free Wheelchair Project 5240 recognized my contributions with multiple Paul Harris Fellowships, and the Rotary Club of Calgary Heritage Park made me an honorary member.

My home boasts a unique feature: a collection of 'Rotary Friendship Trees.' Each tree represents a partnership with a Rotary friend from abroad, someone who collaborated with me on a service project. These trees stand as living symbols of the global reach of Rotary and the power of friendship. One such tree, planted by PDG Gerry Powell from the UK, recently became the center of a heartwarming reunion. Gerry's grandson, during a Kerala tour, made it a point to visit our home and see the tree his grandfather

had planted years ago. It was a beautiful reminder of the enduring legacy of Rotary's work.

A simple "I want to be your friend" message to Rtn George Lewis eventually led to collaborations on projects worth US\$400,000. Now, our DGE, Dr. Tina, is working with him and PDG Tina Fitch. Friendships create a network of connections that expand opportunities for service.

The biggest mistake many make is ignoring international partner Rotarians. While staff at Evanston and past governors are important, the international club members are our true partners in service and friendship. I make a point of introducing myself, my family, and my club to them, maintaining contact even after projects conclude.

My concern extends to the well-being of my Rotarian friends across the globe. Fires, floods, snowstorms, and other crises prompt me to reach out and ensure their safety. Just as we prioritize our own family and friends, we should extend that care to our international Rotary family.

When PDG Peter from the UK fell ill during a visit, we cared for him like family. Similarly, we ensured Liz Wilton and John enjoyed their stay in Munnar. These experiences highlight the importance of genuine care and trust.

My journey has taught me that integrity and transparency are paramount. Service should be driven by sincerity and passion, not solely by the desire for project support. As I believe, "If you lose your integrity, you will also lose your identity, your sensitivity, and your dignity. Integrity is honesty, modesty, and security in all kinds of weather. It should be our priority!" TRF funds are sacred, and Rotarians are our brothers and sisters.

#### **GLOBAL GRANTS**

Global grants support large international activities with sustainable, measurable outcomes in Rotary's areas of focus. By working together to respond to real community needs, clubs and districts strengthen their global partnerships.

#### **ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES**

Global grants support international activities in Rotary's areas of focus:

Humanitarian projects provide sustainable, measurable outcomes that address real community needs. Vocational training improves job skills in a community through educational programs. It also supports teams of professionals who travel abroad to gain knowledge and skills or build the capacity of the community they visit.

Scholarships fund international graduate-level study by people seeking a career in an area of focus. Applications for scholars who will begin studies in August, September, or October are due by 30 June.

#### **CLUB QUALIFICATION FOR GLOBAL GRANTS**

At Rotary, we want every grant to demonstrate that we're ethical, responsible leaders who use our donors' money wisely. Rotary's commitment to sound financial management makes it easier for all of us to find donors, partners, and communities that are ready to work with us.

Qualifying a Rotary Club for global grants takes three steps:

- 1. Complete a grant management seminar. Rotary members involved in grant-funded projects should participate in a grant management seminar in the district. If the members involved in the project cannot take part, your club can send its president-elect or another member. A minimum of one representative from your club must participate in the grant management seminar. Grant management training materials are available in Rotary's Learning Center.
- 2. Complete the club memorandum of understanding (MOU). The MOU is an agreement between your club and district that outlines the Foundation's minimum requirements for managing grants. Your club president and president-elect review the MOU, sign it, and submit it to your district.
- 3. Agree to any additional qualification requirements set by your district. Rotary's policies establish a shared standard for all clubs. Your district might have additional requirements.


